This credit is not only attributed to fashion platforms and/or weeks.

Similarly, agencies play a huge role in the scouting, training, grooming and placing of models. This is why it is very important to acknowledge models who are not signed to any agencies, but working powerfully and independently to get their images and per-

sonal brands on the lips of highly esteemed fashion individuals.

MIMI: I love fashion so much, Growing up, I love dressing up, I used to watch Disney channel growing up and I loved the way they dressed

MIMI: Unstable income, inferiority complex, sexual advances, substance abuse etc.


A-CHOICES: How is modelling stressful?

MIMI: Yeah, modelling is more stressful than it is glamorous. Travelling around the Federation of Nigeria is great, but most of the hours that you spend in a city are spent working. ... Models have to go on interviews all day long to book jobs. They have to master the art of selling themselves to a wide range of professionals. But now I know my worth and I'm going to ask for it.

A-CHOICES: What is products photographer ?

MIMI: A product photographer is responsible for capturing images of products for advertising purposes. Product photographers work with brands to create images that will best represent the product.

A-CHOICES: What would you say are your major achievements?



MIMI: To be honest, I try not to pressure myself with achievements. I've understood that with every goal I smash, there's always a much bigger one. MIMI: I wash my face cleanse twice daily and scrub 3 times a week

We have to make a decision to be collectively responsible. Brands need to stop downplaying what models bring to the table, and understand the importance of respecting people even though they cannot pay our worth. There's a really big difference between "here's what I can afford vs why do you charge this much?". Also, as models, we owe it to ourselves to be transparent. Again, on transparency, I would rather work for free with



someone who has a rather transparent scheme than someone who shows little to no respect to models. Besides remuneration, I focus more on how I am being treated and respected.

The African girls are slaying in Miss World this year especially and I am enjoying every bit of it. Most of all I love it when black and African women are totally in control of their beauty and image, not tied by








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Naomi Campbell, enjoys her first Christmas as a mum...

Now she has shared the first pic of her daughter, with her face covered by an emoji as she expressed her gratefulness at becoming a mother.

Whoopi Goldberg has shut down a rant about Meghan Markle by responding simply with a one-word answer. Discussion on the pair came after their controversial interview with Oprah Winfrey back in March last year.

Meghan McCain said during a chat on The View:

"Monarchies are stupid, the American experiment is the way to go." And if we have two American women, Meghan Markle and Oprah Winfrey, who have single-handedly finished what George Washington and our revolutionary counterparts did, I'm all for it."

Whoopi looked exasperated. Whoopi seemed to have enough of Meghan's rant on the Duchess and the American revolution and responded with a simple: "Okay" after a few seconds of silence. Before responding, Whoopi seemed exasperated and furrowed her brows. The discussion was sparked

when Meghan McCain, 37, brought up Piers Morgan dramatically walking off set. The legendary interview immediately went viral when it came out ten months ago. TV presenter Meghan even tweeted 'bums me out' after the moment went viral. Comedian Justin Martindale reacted to Whoopi's response with a tweet that read: "It's 2021 and we are all Whoopi." The Duchess of Sussex made a few shocking claims during her interview with icon Oprah.

She told the presenter how she felt suicidal during her time in the royal family - a statement that resulted in Piers going on a rant.

Piers said he didn't believe the Suits actress' statements on her mental health during a segment on Good Morning Britain.

His comments received 54,000 Ofcom complaints - the highest number of the year.

In one jaw-dropping moment, Meghan revealed that an unnamed member of the Royal Family was concerned about what colour her son Archie's skin would be.

She said when she was pregnant with Archie there were "concerns and conversations about how dark his skin might be when he's born". Meghan said: "In those months when I was pregnant, we had in tandem the conversations of him not being given security or a title, and also concerns about how dark his skin might be when he's born.

"They didn't want him to be a prince or princess, not knowing what the gender would be, which would be different from protocol, and that he wasn't going to receive security,"

Nigerian nurse sentenced to 3 years imprisonment for sexually abusing patients in U.S

A Nigerian health worker, Godbless Uwadiogwu, who pleaded guilty to sex crimes involving memory care patients in the United States has been jailed.

A 59-year-old former nurse aide, Godbless Uwadiogwu, has been sentenced to three years imprisonment by a U.S court after pleading guilty to sexually abusing patients.

Uwadiogwu had his sentence on Tuesday, December 28, 2021 after he was accused of having sexual contact with two patients in two different facilities: Traditions of Deerfield and Otterbein Seniorlife in Maineville.

According to Fox News, the convict will also be required to register as a Tier sex offender for at least 15 years.


Uwadiogwu pleaded guilty in November to two felony counts of gross sexual imposition. He was previously indicted on three rape charges and three charges of gross sexual imposition. The rape charges and one of the gross sexual imposition counts were dropped as part of the plea.

Prosecutors sought the maximum sentence. However, his attorney unsuccessfully argued in court that Uwadiogwu was not a repeat offender and only a “moderate risk.”

Meanwhile, Uwadiogwu faces similar charges from two alleged incidents in Butler County, in Hamilton in September 2018 and in Middletown in December 2013.

A Butler County grand jury indicted him in November on five charges including rape, two counts of gross sexual imposition, sexual battery and unlawful restraint, according to the court.

Hamilton police records allege he was a state-tested nursing assistant when he had sexual contact in a private home in 2018 with a disabled victim who could not resist or give consent due to her condition.



The other report, from Middletown police is from 2013. The victim stated that she was friends with Uwadiogwu and said that he was pushing to become her home health provider when he sexually assaulted her.

In addition, victim advocate, Erika Bourelle, read letters on behalf of the victims and their families.


One letter was written by one of the victims herself.

“Some people may not remember, but I do. This happened on his first day in my building. I needed assistance after using the restroom and he came in to help me wipe,” she wrote.

Adieu Archbishop Desmond Tutu


Desmond Tutu, the former Archbishop of Cape Town who won the 1984 Nobel Peace Prize for his impassioned campaign against apartheid in South Africa while Nelson Mandela languished in prison, dies at 90.

Archbishop Desmond Tutu, the South African cleric and social activist who was a giant of the struggle against apartheid, has died last month at of age 90, prompting tributes from religious leaders, politicians and activists from around the world.

Tutu, described by observers at home and abroad as the moral conscience of the nation, died in Cape Town on Boxing Day, weeks after the death of FW de Klerk, the country's last white president. "The passing of archbishop emeritus Desmond Tutu is another chapter of bereavement in our nation's farewell to a generation of outstanding South Africans who have bequeathed us a liberated South Africa," said President Cyril Ramaphosa. "From the pavements of resistance in South Africa to the pulpits of the world's great cathedrals and places of worship, and the prestigious setting of the Nobel peace prize ceremony, the Arch distinguished himself as a non-sectarian, inclusive champion of universal human rights."

Tutu, 90, died of cancer at a care center in Cape Town, the Archbishop Desmond Tutu Trust said in a statement. He had been diagnosed with prostate cancer in 1997 and had been hospitalized several times in recent years.

A moral beacon in a deeply troubled land, the impish priest in the purple cassock stood for decades as an inspiring symbol of courage, dignity and hope in a nation that at times seemed doomed to civil war. His





Then, after the success of the anti-apartheid movement, he served as a goad to the governing African National Congress, upbraiding leaders over corruption and failure to adequately address the nation's widespread poverty.

He shrieked with joy when South Africans lined up peacefully to vote in the first all-race elections in April 1994. He giggled with glee when he raised the hand of Mandela, the long-imprisoned leader of the African National Congress, and introduced "our brand-new president, out of the box" to crowds in Cape Town the following month.

As leader of the South African Council of Churches and later as Anglican archbishop of Cape Town, Archbishop Tutu led the church to the forefront of Black South Africans' decades-long struggle for freedom. His voice was a powerful force for non-violence in the anti-apartheid movement, earning him a Nobel Peace Prize in 1984

When that movement triumphed in the early 1990s, he prodded the country toward a new relationship between its white and Black citizens, and, as chairman of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, he gathered testimony documenting the viciousness of apartheid.

fervent pleas for peace and racial justice, along with his irrepressible sense of humour, were a constant balm to a country on the edge.

Tutu held a unique place in apartheid-era South Africa, and he used his stature as an Anglican prelate to navigate violent crosscurrents. He wept at funerals for victims of apartheid, risked his life to stop violence by Black protesters, and defied death threats by white people for leading the international campaign to impose economic and cultural sanctions against the white minority regime.





Then, in 2011, as critics accused the A.N.C. of corruption and mismanagement, Archbishop Tutu again assailed the government, this time in terms that would have once been unimaginable. “This government, our government, is worse than the apartheid government,” he said, “because at least you were expecting it with the apartheid government.”

He added: “Mr. Zuma, you and your government don’t represent me. You represent your own interests. I am warning you out of love, one day we will start praying for the defeat of

“You are overwhelmed by the extent of evil,” he said. But, he added, it was necessary to open the wound to cleanse it. In return for an honest accounting of past crimes, the committee offered amnesty, establishing what Archbishop Tutu called the principle of restorative — rather than retributive — justice.

His credibility was crucial to the commission’s efforts to get former members of the South African security forces and former guerrilla fighters to cooperate with the inquiry.

In 2004, the archbishop accused President Thabo Mbeki, Mr. Mandela’s successor, of pursuing policies that enriched a tiny elite while “many, too many, of our people live in gruelling, demeaning, dehumanizing poverty.” “We are sitting on a powder keg,” he said.

Although he and Mr. Mbeki later reconciled — they were photographed together in 2015 as Mr. Mbeki, by then the former president, visited Archbishop Tutu in a hospital — the archbishop remained unhappy about the state of affairs in his country under its next president, Jacob G. Zuma, who had denied Mr. Mbeki another term despite being embroiled in scandal.

the A.N.C. government. You are disgraceful.”

His words seemed prophetic when, in 2016, an alliance of religious leaders in South Africa joined other critics in urging Mr. Zuma to quit. In early 2018, Mr. Zuma was ousted after a power struggle with his deputy, Mr. Ramaphosa, who took over the presidency in February of that year.

His moral leadership, combined with his winning effervescence, made him something of a global celebrity. He was photographed at glittering social functions, appeared in documentaries and chatted with talk-show hosts. Even in late 2015, when his health seemed poor, he met with Prince Harry of Britain, who presented him with an honour on behalf of Queen Elizabeth II.

Dr. Dre settles divorce with \$100 million payment to his ex-wife

American Rap Superstar, Dr. Dre has finally settled his divorce with Nicole Young following an acrimonious divorce and a bitter court battle.

The rapper and legendary producer has agreed to pay out \$100million (£74million) to his ex-wife with \$50m (£37m) being paid out immediately and another \$50m in a year's time, according to TMZ.

The settlement means that Dre will get to keep seven of the properties the pair own, including his \$100m Brentwood estate, two homes in Calabasas, a Malibu property and four other homes in the Los Angeles area. Dre will also retain full rights to his master recordings,



trademarks, Apple stocks – including proceeds from the sale of Beats by Dre – and interests in partnerships and trusts.

However, the pair will divide their fleet of cars with Dr keeping six while Young will take the other four .

Young will also keep jewellery, cash and bank accounts that she had during the marriage, but must pay her own legal fees. The settlement comes after Young filed for divorce in June 2020, citing “irreconcilable differences”. The pair married in 1996. Earlier last year, Young handed divorce papers to Dre during his grandmother's burial.

Meanwhile, Dre, Eminem, Snoop Dogg, Mary J. Blige and Kendrick Lamar are all set to perform at next year's Super Bowl Halftime Show. Set to take place at SoFi Stadium in Inglewood, California on Sunday, February 13, 2022, the Pepsi Super Bowl LVI Half-time Show will mark the first time the five multi-award-winning artists have ever performed together on the same stage.

One of two men convicted for murdering Michael Jordan's father has his impending parole revoked.




The scheduled August 2024 parole for one of two men convicted in the murder of the father of NBA great Michael Jordan nearly three decades ago has been cancelled, a North Carolina state panel said.

The state Post-Release Supervision and Parole Commission had announced in 2020 that Larry M. Demery would be released as part of an agreement in which he would take part in a scholastic and vocational program designed to prepare him for life outside prison. The initial release date was August 2023, but it was later pushed back by 12 months.

The commission said that Demery's 'agreement has been terminated' effective immediately, giving no reason. Demery, now 46, has been serving a life sentence at a minimum security prison in Lincoln County, northwest of Charlotte, for the murder of James Jordan in 1993. Prison records show Demery has had 19 infractions lodged against him since 2001, including two for 'substance possession' earlier this month. Demery would be reviewed again for parole on or about December 15, 2023, the release said.

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AFCON Coverage 'Tinged With Racism' – Arsenal Legend Ian Wright

Former England striker Ian Wright says media coverage of the Africa Cup of Nations is “tinged with racism” as Premier League stars prepare to travel to Cameroon for the tournament.

The Gunners legend hits out at those castigating the 33rd edition of the African competition set to kick off on January 9 in Yaounde.

The 33rd edition of the African competition has been shrouded in controversy with several clubs across Europe not prepared to release players to represent their respective countries in the competition.

The 58-year-old Wright, who played for the Gunners in the Premier League and managed to score 128 goals from 221 appearances, has cited racism while showing his concerns on questions being posed by journalists to African players ahead of the competition.

In a video posted by Wright on his *Tiktok*, he posed a question: “Is there ever a tournament more disrespected than the Africa Cup of Nations? There is no great honour, none other than representing your country. The coverage is completely tinged with racism.

“We played our Euros across 10 countries in the middle of the Covid-19 pandemic and no issues.

Cameroon, a single country hosting the tournament is a problem.

“Imagine a journalist asking players if they will be honouring the call ups for their national teams. Have you ever heard anyone asking Three Lion players if they ever honour a call-up?”

Wright has further reminded clubs in Europe that some of the best players in their leagues are currently Africans. “Some of the best players in Europe right now are Africans. If we love them at our clubs, why not love them at their national teams across the globe,” Wright continued.

Wright, who also played for West Ham United in the Premier League, also hailed Ivory Coast striker Sebastien Haller for taking his stand of representing the



African nation at Afcon at the expense of Ajax and also Crystal Palace manager Patrick Vieira for supporting the same.

“Why is this tournament constantly getting so much flak? Shout outs to countries that have qualified and players like Sebastien Haller who has taken a stand against the media backlash plus Patrick Vieira,” Wright added.

“Vieira coming out and speak about it. And being a black manager, people can understand where his roots are and how important this tournament is to African people. This shame has gone on for too long.”

“That’s why I wish Cameroon all success in hosting this tournament and like I said to the players, all the very best and the fans.”

Asked whether he will stay to honour Ajax matches against FC Utrecht away and PSV Eindhoven, Haller said: “This statement shows the disrespect for Africa. Would this ever have been presented to a European player towards a European Championship?”

“This tournament was actually supposed to be held in the summer but was postponed due to corona. Of course, I will go to the Africa Cup of Nations to rep-

resent Ivory Coast. That is the highest honour.” And of course, I would have liked to have taken the plane in between to be able to play against FC Utrecht and PSV, but that is simply impossible.

“This situation is very frustrating. I hate having to choose between my country and my club. That’s really shit. I play with Ajax for the title and those two matches are very important because they influence the ranking.





THE JOY AND STRUGGLE OF MARRIAGE IN SOUTH SUDAN

Marriage is a catalyst for societal growth; it forms the smallest unit of the society through reproduction. Different ethnic groups and cultures have different methods of conducting marriages. The Dinka people of South Sudan along sides other cultures are no exception to having peculiar custom of marriage.

The concept of paying bride price is a wide spread custom in Africa, though the method of payment may differ from culture to culture, it however remains a ritual that must be carried out before the marriage happens.

For the people of South Sudan, the traditional currencies for paying bride prices are cows and goats; this practice is most common among the Dinka, Mundari, Nuer and Teposa tribes, an online report says. It is gathered that young men that can't afford to pay many cattle feel embarrass.

Paying huge numbers of cattle to the bride's family also mean that the intending groom is rich and a first class citizen. Sadly, this practice has lead several young men into cattle rustling just to meet up with the demand and to protect their pride and also prove their love to their brides.

The tradition of livestock currency has again pushed several young men to marrying at an older age while they take younger (underage) girls as brides. This is because they spend most of their lives acquiring cat-

tle to pay up for their brides. The least number of cattle a young man is expected to pay as bride price is 20 and it goes as high as 300 or more.

Another custom of the Dinka people is the four years freedom the bride has after marriage. Though her bride price paid, the custom allows the bride a four years period without cooking or doing any chores. The period is referred to as "Anyuuc" which means "generous welcoming". During this period, the groom's sisters do all the chores in the house.

After the four years is over, the husband will throw a big party called "that" a cooking festival to usher her into cooking for her husband and the family. In that party, three cows and five goats are slaughtered, however, if her husband misbehaves during the Anyuuc period, the wife can leave and her bride price mustn't be returned to her husband. Most women would wish this very practice is part of their tradition because of relieve and freedom that comes with it.

Also popular among the Dinka and Nuer people is the practice of ghost wedding. A situation where a woman is married to a dead man; in most cases, the ghost marriage happens when the groom passes on shortly before the marriage. Interestingly, these women are not seen as widows but rather as fully married women.

During the ceremony, the brother of the deceased will stand in for his brother and after the wedding, he takes up the responsibility of a husband to her but then again, her brother in-law cannot refer to her as



his wife. She can also however have children with her brother in-law but they are referred to as children of the late husband/brother.

Although ghost marriage is part of their culture, the ceremony has declined due to modernization and education. The ghost marriage tradition practice is not vibrant as it used to be in the past; however, some ethnic groups in South Sudan still find it very necessary to preserve the culture as they still practice it.

Most women dislike the ghost wedding tradition, but others see it as means of maintaining their wealth other than sharing it with a man or loose it in a regular marriage.

Our culture in Africa signifies our identities. However, there is need for some regulations in the practice of these traditions. For South Sudan, it only got its independence in 2011 after decades of civil war, the political system is fragile and government will struggle to enforce new rules about bride price because many families are living below the poverty line and the bride prices are just means to get out of poverty.

Ex-Feyenoord star Christian Gyan tragically dies of cancer

Former Feyenoord and Wrexham star Christian Gyan has died of cancer at the age of just 43. Gyan was born in Ghana but moved to Netherlands in the late 1990s to sign for Feyenoord, where he made 93 appearances.

A touch-tackling defender, Gyan helped the club win the Eredivisie in 1999 and the UEFA Cup in 2002.

He remained with Feyenoord until 2008 when he signed for Finnish side TPS.

In January 2009 he joined National League side Wrexham but only made two appearances before being released.

He later had spells with RoPS and Dutch amateur side RKSV Leonidas before hanging up his boots.

The late star also made 23 appearances for Ghana

between 1998 and 2002.

Gyan had been battling illness in the period leading up to his death and earlier this month posted on Facebook about his situation. Facebook about his situation.

"Good evening, my friends, news about my current situation is circulating without my consent. However, I am here to announce that, as you all know, I have been ill for a while. But I'm fine and I'm not dying!" he wrote four weeks ago. "So please, there is no need to panic. I respect the doctors, but you all know me: I am a man of faith. That's why I believe that things will get better. What is impossible from a human perspective is possible with God. So please pray for me to get well. Thank you all, my friends."

Former Feyenoord striker Bonaventure Kalou was among those to pay tribute to his former team-mate and friend. "Rest in peace my friend, you fought hard. My thoughts go to Anita and the children," Kalou wrote on Instagram.

Others displayed their emotion on Twitter, with one fan saying: "Rest in peace, Christian Gyan. You silence us all! Rest in peace hero!"

While another Dutch supporter added: "Way too sweet for this world. For him, I hope there is a beautiful and well-deserved afterlife. #ChristianGyan #Feyenoord."

Iconic striker Pierre Van Hooijdonk, who played in Britain for Celtic, Nottingham Forest and Hull City, responded to the news with a simple message which said: "R.I.P KING ! #christiangyan."

O.J. Simpson a 'completely free man' as parole ends in Nevada

O.J. Simpson is a free man. The 74-year-old former football hero and actor, acquitted California murder defendant and convicted As Vegas armed robber was granted good behaviour credits and discharged from parole effective Dec.1,2021. Nevada State Police spokeswoman Kim Yoko Smith said.

The former NFL star was convicted in 2008 of robbery and kidnapping in a dispute over sports memorabilia at a Las Vegas casino hotel. "Mr. Simpson is a completely free man now," said Malcolm LaVergne, Simpson's lawyer in Las Vegas.

Simpson, 74, declined an immediate interview, his attorney said, and LaVergne declined to talk about Simpson's future plans, including whether he intends


to remain in Nevada. He told parole officials before his release from prison on Oct. 1, 2017, that he planned to move to Florida.

He instead moved to a gated community in Las Vegas where he plays golf and frequently takes to Twitter to offer opinions about college and pro sports, especially football.

"Life is fine," he told The Associated Press during a June 2019 interview.

Simpson's saga makes him, in the words of one of his Las Vegas trial lawyers, one of the most famous people on the planet.

Simpson was acquitted by a jury in 1995 of killing his ex-wife Nicole Brown Simpson and her friend



Ronald Goldman. In 1997, he lost a civil wrongful death suit and the court awarded a \$33.5m judgement against him.

NFL achievements and acting career. Nicknamed The Juice, he rose to fame in US sport for his achievements in the NFL. He was enrolled in the sport's hall of fame and was the first running back to gain 2,000 yards in a season with the Buffalo Bills in 1973. But he also became known as a pitchman, football commentator and actor, appearing in a number of TV and film roles including the Naked Gun movie series.

He grew up in public housing in San Francisco, attended the University of Southern California and won the Heisman Trophy as college football's best player in 1968.

In a separate case more than a decade later, Simpson was convicted by a jury in Las Vegas in October 2008 and served nine years in prison for leading five men, including two with guns, in a September 2007 confrontation with two sports collectibles dealers at a Las Vegas casino hotel.

Simpson insisted he only wanted to retrieve personal mementoes and items stolen from him following his acquittal in the double killings.



Baroness Amos was previously made a Companion of Honour in the Queen's Birthday Honours list in 2016. The new appointment can only be made by the

Queen and only three have been made this year. The other two have gone to former prime minister Tony Blair and the Duchess of Cornwall. The latter has received the Order in recognition of her contribution to the monarchy.

A statement from Buckingham Palace said: "The Queen has been graciously pleased to appoint The Right Honourable Valerie Ann, Baroness Amos C.H. to be a Lady Companion."





Guyana-born Valerie Amos moved to Great Britain with her family in 1963 and built a career working for equal opportunities. As a member of the House of Lords, she served as the government spokeswoman for social security, international development, women's issues, and foreign and Commonwealth affairs.

Between 1989 and 1994 she was chief executive of the Equal Opportunities Commission. She was a co-founder and director of Amos Fraser Bernard, advising the South African government on public service reform, human rights and employment equity. Baroness Amos became Leader of the House of Lords and Lord President of the Council in late 2003.

She held the positions of parliamentary under-Secretary for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs from June 2001, with responsibility for Africa, the Commonwealth, the Caribbean, Britain's Overseas Territories, Consular Affairs and Personnel Issues.

Her role as International Development Secretary

came after Clare Short quit the post in protest at the war in Iraq in 2003. Baroness Amos also served as a Government Whip in the House of Lords between 1998 and 2001 and spokesperson on Social Security, International Development and Women's Issues. Each year, Royal Knights and Ladies of the Order of the Garter gather at St George's Chapel in Windsor for a colourful procession and ceremony.

Watched by crowds of onlookers, they walk down the hill to the chapel from the State Apartments, dressed in blue velvet mantles, red velvet hoods, black velvet hats and white ostrich plumes.

Royal Knights and Ladies in the Order include the Prince of Wales, the Duke of Cambridge, the Princess Royal, the Duke of York and the Earl of Wessex.

The author claimed Tyson accused his friend of having an affair with Givens and angrily approached Trump.


"Could I ask you, are you f***** my wife?" Tyson reportedly asked Trump.

friendship began.

Despite being from polar ends of life, Trump and Tyson shared a common theme through their disjointed childhoods.

Trump went on to host more of Tyson's events with four of his seven title defences falling in Atlantic City which turned into a "Mecca" for American boxing.

The former president later became a chief-advisor to Tyson's business affairs but also tried to establish an adversary role in Tyson's marriage with Givens.

Despite their friendship being tested during this time,

Tyson said in a 2016 interview with The Daily Caller : "That sh** is the real deal.

Listen: I'm a black mother***** from the poorest town in the country. I've been through a lot in life.

"And I know him. When I see him, he shakes my hand and respects my family. None of them-Barack, whoever- nobody else does that. They're gonna be who they are and disregard me, my family."

"So I'm voting for him. If I can get 200,000 people or more to vote for him, I'm gonna do it."

Tyson then went on to explain how his association with Trump came about and detailed their similarities.

"We're really good friends. We go back to

'86, '87. Most of my successful and best fights were at Trump's hotels. He didn't manage me, though. He was just helping me with my court case.

"We're the same guy. A thrust for power, a drive for power. Whatever field we're in, we need power in that field. That's just who we are."

Spanish tax authorities say Eto'o owes nearly one million euros

Cameroon football legend Samuel Eto'o owes nearly one million euros in taxes from his time in Spain, local authorities said. The 40-year-old, who recently was elected president of the Cameroon Football Federation, appeared on a list published by the Spanish tax office of people and companies that owe over 600,000 euros (\$678,000). The former striker is listed as owing 981,598.19 euros to the Spanish tax office.

The four-time African player of the year played for a series of Spanish clubs, including Real Madrid and Barcelona, before retiring from football in 2019. Contacted by AFP, a tax office spokesman said he was not authorized to give details on the player's tax debt. Spanish public prosecutors in 2016 accused Eto'o of conspiring to evade 3.9 million euros in taxes owed on income from his image rights when he was playing for FCBarcelona.

Paris Saint-Germain's Brazilian forward Neymar topped the annual list last year, with the tax office saying at the time he owed 34.6 million euros from when he played for Barcelona from 2013- 2017.

Spain has cracked down on footballers for not paying their fair share in taxes in recent years, including Argentina's Lionel Messi and Portugal's Cristiano Ronaldo.



Koffi Olomidé cleared of rape but convicted of holding dancers

An appeals court in France ruled that Congolese singer Koffi Olomide was not guilty of raping four of his dancers, but convicted him of holding them against their will.

The same court ruled in 2019 that the African star was guilty of statutory rape of one of the dancers as she was just 15 years old but overturned the ruling in Olomide's most recent court appearance.

But he was convicted of depriving the women of their liberty at a villa in Paris between 2002 and 2006. He is to serve an 18-month suspended sentence and pay them compensation.

The public prosecutor for the case called for Olomide to serve a minimum of eight years in jail

with his accusers severely disappointed in the verdict.

"The dancers were obviously disappointed about the sexual assault verdicts because this was the most important thing for them," said their lawyer, David Desgranges.



One of them had alleged he had assaulted them "in hotels, sometimes in the cars... in recording studios".

The court in Versailles did not find Olomidé guilty of sexual assault, with the judge overturning the rape



charge over "changing and sometimes contradictory" evidence from his accusers. However the court found his actions saw the women "deprived of all liberties and constantly watched" by two of his accomplices who shut them in a room with the blinds drawn.

In 2008 he was accused of kicking a cameraman from DR Congo's private RTGA television station and breaking his camera at a concert, but the two later were later reconciled

In addition to the suspended sentence he was ordered to pay a fine of 10,000-32,000 euros (\$11,000-36,000) to each dancer.

Olomidé, whose real name is Antoine Agbepa Mumba, is one of Africa's most popular singers.

The singer has been in trouble with the law several times before:

In 2018 Zambia ordered his arrest after he allegedly assaulted a photographer

In 2016 he was arrested and deported after he assaulted one of his dancers in Kenya

In 2012 he was convicted in DR Congo of assaulting his producer and received a three-month suspended prison sentence

Croydon: Jail for woman who landed senior NHS post with bogus CV

A woman who cheated her way into a top NHS post with lies on her CV and bogus references has been jailed for 12 months.

Chanelle Poku, 29, pretended she had a Master's degree in molecular biology and experience leading a charity to land a senior job with NHS Croydon's Clinical Commissioning Group.

She was put in charge of delivering programmes for urgent care patients in the borough, and when challenged over her failing performance she made a string of false accusations of bullying, assault and racism.

Poku, who even sent a bogus letter from a lawyer to the NHS to try to derail the investigation into her conduct, was found guilty by a jury of fraud by false representation.


"This was a role of some responsibility and you plainly didn't have the skills for it", said Recorder David Osborne, sentencing Poku to 12 months. "It is clear to me you have done everything you can to throw investigators off the scent in this case, and you continue to deny involvement in it.

"Your offending left a wholly-unqualified person in charge of an important role in the local NHS infrastructure. This offence is so serious that only an immediate custody is justified."

Croydon Crown Court heard that Poku had worked for charity Action Aid, collecting money in the street and going door-to-door asking for donations. She pretended her role had been much more senior when

applying for the Commissioning and Programme Lead for Urgent Care post in December 2019

When questions arose about her performance and capability she claimed she was the victim of bullying, assault and racism. Poku also sent a letter to the NHS pretending to be a lawyer in a bid to stop the investigation into her legitimacy.



The Master's degree she claimed to have was fabricated after she saw it was a requirement on the job advertisement. Recorder David Osborne sentenced her to 12 months and said: "This was a role of some responsibility and you plainly didn't have the skills for it." Religion preventing Nigerians from thinking like rational humans: Wole Soyinka



The respected Nobel laureate Wole Soyinka says religion has become a major problem in the country, preventing Nigerians from thinking rationally. “Religion has become the number one problem for Nigerians,” Prof. Soyinka said, adding that any religion that becomes an excuse for the adherents to flout Nigeria’s laws, should be “tackled head-on.”

“If for instance a legislator, later a Governor, can claim the right to be a paedophile and indulge in cross-border child trafficking, celebrating child marriage.

“Then consummating that event, which is against the law of a nation, and he says he has a right to do it because his religion permits it; then both he and that religion should just be shown the way to the law courts and treated like other phenomena of society,”



Prof. Soyinka made the comment while speaking recently with a professor of African Literature, Louisa Egbunike, Channels TV reported. He advocated for putting religion “in its place in order for people to be liberated as rational beings.”

Mr Soyinka decried the use of “religion to subvert the rights of others, to the extent of primordial rights to kill,” arguing that religion should be practiced privately.

Prof. Soyinka said Mr Soyinka said the same treatment should be meted to those who “use religion to excuse building a church which collapses on the head of humanity, many of them not from Nigeria, several from South Africa. “And then you say it was caused by supernatural forces when you know very well that you flouted the conditions for increasing the floors of your building.”



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
