

Christine is a graduate of Human Psychology at the prestigious University of Calabar. Not new to the pageantry, She competed at Miss Earth Nigeria 2019. Telfer finished fifth, earning the Miss Earth Nigeria Eco Tourism 2019 title. In the midst of her busy schedule, the stunning beauty has taken out time to talk about her advocacy, dreams, ambitions and guilty pleasures in an exclusive interview with A-CHOICES.

A-CHOICES: Christine can you please tell us a little bit about yourself and educational background?

CHRISTINE:I'm Christine-telfer Edet Ugah,I'm 24 years old.People learn everyday and the learning process never ends till the day we go,I currently have a degree in physiology and also a degree in biotechnology and hopefully will add more certificates to this soon.

A-CHOICES: What inspired you to the world of pageantry, Previous beauty competitions?



A-CHOICES: What do you love about Nigeria? What would like to change about Nigeria?




A-CHOICES: What music are you listening to? Your favourite TV shows? Your favourite meal?


A-CHOICES: Final question, is there anything you'd like to see change regarding beauty?






British Police Declare Temitope Adeyinka Wanted,Offer £10,000

"It's only a matter of time before we find you. The best thing you can do is hand yourself in and tell your side of the story, before it's told for you."

That's the message from Detective Superintendent Stephen Jennings, who's appealing for the whereabouts of a man wanted in connection with the Robert Powell murder investigation.

To help Robert's family get the answers they deserve, anyone with information leading to the arrest of 38-year-old Temitope Adeyinka could also be eligible for a reward of up to £10,000 through the charity Crimestoppers.

The appeal comes after the arrest of a second man wanted in connection with Robert's murder.

Robert was killed in June 2020

Robert, 50, was shot outside an address in Roydon in the early hours of Saturday 13 June 2020. He died from his injuries the following day.

As part of our investigation, we previously appealed for the whereabouts for three men wanted in connection with Robert's death.

We can now confirm that through the work of our Kent and Essex Serious Crime Directorate, working closely with the National Crime Agency and other law enforcement colleagues around the world, two of the three men are now in custody.

The latest man to be arrested, Israar Shah, 38, was located in Spain and has already been extradited back to the UK. He appeared in court on Monday 20 March to face the charge of murder and was remanded in custody.

He will next appear at Chelmsford Crown Court on Monday 12 June.

Nana Oppong, 42, was previously detained by Moroccan authorities and formally arrested under a Red Notice and Provisional Arrest Request for the offences of murder, possession of a firearm with intent to endanger life and wounding without intent.

He remains in Moroccan custody while extradition proceedings continue.

A third man is still outstanding

The third man, 38-year-old Temitope Adeyinka, also known as Limo, is still outstanding and a European Arrest Warrant is in place to facilitate his capture.

The charity Crimestoppers, which is independent of the police, have also increased their reward to up to £10,000 for any information that leads to his arrest. Information can be given 100% anonymously.

Senior Investigating Officer Detective Superintendent Stephen Jennings said: "Robert's death was shocking, violent and heartless.

"There's a loving family, a mother, children, grandchildren, who have spent more than two-and-a-half years in a state of limbo and grief. They need and deserve answers. "Through round the clock work with the National Crime Agency and our partners across the globe, two men we wanted to speak with have been detained in connection with Robert's murder.

"We will not stop until we've spoken to everyone we believe could be involved and there's still one man in particular we want to speak to.

"Thirty-eight-year-old Temitope Adeyinka, also known as Limo, is around 5ft 8ins tall and of a medium build. He has links to areas in East London but we believe he may have travelled abroad.

"We want anyone who may know of Limo's current whereabouts to come forward as soon as you can.

"I'm also making this direct appeal to you Limo – it's only a matter of time before we find you.

"The best thing you can do is hand yourself in and tell your side of the story, before it's told for you.

"The charity Crimestoppers have increased their reward to up to £10,000 for any information that leads to Temitope's arrest.



I argue we cannot have peace when children, women and a section of society is traumatised by their own inner demons, they will lash out and not be the productive members they can be, because their mind is not free to fulfil their potential.

JAY-Z's Net Worth Has Increased To \$2.5 Billion

rom rags to riches, Jay-Z proves his worth as he maintains the title of the
 richest rapper in the world with a whopping net worth of \$2.5 billion!

He is reportedly the 1,203rd wealthiest person on earth. Social media is stunned and we can't help but be in awe of his success story. But what's the secret behind his astounding fortune? Find out the intriguing details that will leave you wanting more, only in the full article!

According to Forbes, the Roc Nation tycoon is now worth a whopping \$2.5 billion following the recent sale of D'USSÉ.

JAY-Z is not the only rapper in the billionaire's club. Back in October, Diddy became the second richest man in hip-hop with a net worth of \$1 billion, thanks to his Ciroc partnership with Diageo, DeLeón Tequila, and REVOLT media network. He is now looking to add to his business portfolio and acquire a majority ownership stake in BET.

A 2022 list of hip-hop's wealthiest artists from former Forbes editor Zack O'Malley Greenburg also included Kanye West (\$500 million), Berner (\$410 million), and Dr. Dre (\$400 million).








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Alison Hammond:Man arrested over blackmail claims.





BLACKMAIL suspect thought to have targeted TV host Alison Hammond has been arrested. West Midlands police said the 36-year-old was arrested at an address in Warwickshire on 25th Saturday last month.

According to a relaible report, the This Morning presenter, 48, has paid out large sums after falling victim. It is alleged the Birmingham-born celebrity had been threatened that lies would be spread about her if she did not co-operate with demands.

On Sunday evening, police said the man had been released on conditional bail. Alison Hammond has broken her silence after it was revealed over the weekend that a man had been arrested on suspicion of blackmail.

Taking to Instagram, the presenter, 48, shared a beaming selfie from her 'girls night' with pals Holly Willoughby, Nicole Appleton and Emma Bunton, writing the caption: 'Needed that.'

Alison allegedly told pals she handed over thousands of pounds and a car to a former friend who threatened to leak false details about her private life. The presenter came to prominence as a contestant on the third series of Big Brother in 2002.

She was promoted to co-presenter of This Morning in 2020, appearing alongside Dermot O'Leary on Fridays. There have also been appearances on I'm a Celebrity... Get Me Out of Here! in 2010 and Strictly Come Dancing in 2014.

Leeds man forced to 'eat bread and butter and cook once a week' as council flat electric is '£10 a day'

n irate Leeds man has raged about paying "10 pounds a day" for electricity at his council flat despite only "cooking once a week" and eating mostly bread and butter to save energy.

Unemployed Mamadu Djalo, 63, is struggling with money having only recently applied for Universal Credit. In addition, he is burdened with a prepaid meter that eats up his balance at an alarming rate, where he pays "£50 every five days" – although he takes extreme precautions to limit performance.

He's been at his wit's end, trying to figure out why the leccy bill is so high in his flat in Seacroft. Mamadu moved to Leeds City Council high rise Seacroft Gate, in Eastdown Grange, with his 17-year-old son last month.

The pair, originally from Senegal, have been trying "everything" to keep electricity costs down. They'll make one big batch of food once a week and freeze it, eat "bread and butter" for most meals, turn off all the lights and heaters and more, yet still the 63-year-old is paying £10 a day.

The council has said the meter was not installed by them and has encouraged its tenants to get in touch with their suppliers.

Mamadu, who lost his job as a cleaner last year and has lived in Leeds for 11 years, vented his frustrations. He said: "Oh my god, it's been very hard. We have to pay £50 for five days for the electric top-up.

"We haven't been putting on the lights. We might make a little coffee, but everything is off. Sometimes the heater comes on at night but by 7am, it's off.

"We've tried everything! I don't have a washing machine, we cook one time a week and put it in the freezer, that's it. Otherwise we'll eat bread with butter.

"Every five days it's £50, no matter what! From the day I signed the contract, I was told it would be £20 on the meter. But for three or four days of the week, we switched off all of the lights and all the credit we had left was £5."


A Leeds City Council spokesperson said: "The council recognises the impact of high energy prices on our tenants and their families, however the electricity metering equipment is not installed by the council and we are not responsible for the rates charged.

"As a council we are able to offer some support to people who are struggling with high energy bills, but our first advice is always for the customer to get in touch with their supplier. Information about support available can be found on our website."

After Leeds Live made the council aware of this issue, the local authority contacted Mamadu and he's pleased with its advice in regards to obtaining a better tariff. Days after deleting almost all his pictures and videos from his Instagram page, the singer announced his new project with a short teaser of his new album.





Nigerian politician, wife, and a doctor guilty of organ trafficking to UK

senior Nigerian politician, his wife, and a doctor have been convicted of organ trafficking, in the first verdict of its kind under the Modern Slavery Act.

Ike Ekweremadu,60, a former deputy president of the Nigerian senate, his wife, Beatrice, 56, and Dr Obinna Obeta, 50, were found guilty of facilitating the travel of a young man to Britain with a view to his exploitation after a sixweek trial at the Old Bailey.

They criminally conspired to bring the 21-year-old Lagos street trader to London to exploit him for his kidney, the jury found.

The man, who cannot be named for legal reasons, had been offered an illegal reward to become a donor for the senator's daughter after kidney disease forced her to drop out of a master's degree in film at Newcastle University, the court heard. Sonia Ekweremadu was found not guilty.

Despite not being convicted, Sonia sobbed uncontrollably in the dock, after hearing her parents' convictions. Her mother sobbed as well, but she wiped her tears and stopped, as the court was still in session. Sonia continued crying. The Senator sat back in his chair and didn't immediately show any emotion.

After the judge had discharged the jury and the court had ended, Ekweremadu then went and put his arms around his daughter and wife. All three embraced for about a minute. Sonia continued crying. Her mother removed her cream woolen hat and gave it to her. The Senator had a brief chat with his wife, and when he later looked up to wave at his sons and family and friends, he too had a tear in his eyes. Ekweremadu and his wife were later led out of the dock by security guards.

In the public gallery, tears also flowed freely from two female family members. Though the Senator's two sons looked dejected and shocked as the guilty verdicts were announced, both kept their emotions tight.

Afterward, family and friends rallied round them outside the court and asked them to "stay strong." Sonia was still in tears outside court, but was soon escorted away by family and friends. Her barrister, John Femi Ola, KC, had a tear in his eyes outside the court as he hugged one of the Senator's sons.

The day unfolded less than an hour after the 12 jurors resumed their deliberations in the jury room soon after 10:00am. At about 10:47 (UK time), one of the security guards outside the four courtrooms on the second floor informed that "there's a verdict in court 5." Prior to then, there had been an announcement over the public address system that "all the parties in the Ekweremadu's case should be in court 5, immediately." Since the jury was sent out on Monday afternoon, that tone had never been used whenever the jury needed to come back to court.

After family and friends were led into the courtroom, things moved speedily from then. At 10.51, the court usher made the familiar announcement:" jury in court." All the 12 filed out into courtroom, led by the foreman. The graveyard-like silence was tangible from the moment the court clerk faced the dock and said, could "all the defendants please stand?" All four got on their feet in the dock.

The clerk turned to the jury, saying, "Mr. foreman, please stand. The tall gentleman did the needful. She now asked him, members of the jury, "what is your verdict on the first defendant, Obinna Obeta? He said "guilty."

Continuing, she asked, "members of the jury, what is your verdict on the second defendant, Ike Ekweremadu?" He replied with "guilty."

She repeated the question again, asking: "what is your verdict regarding Sonia Ekweremadu?" The foreman said: "not guilty." Finally, the clerk asked the foreman: "what is your verdict concerning Beatrice Ekweremadu?" Foreman said: "guilty."


Walker appeared alongside Tyrese in multiple Fast & the Furious films before dying in a 2013 car accident.

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




Gabonese student killed in Turkey

The death of a Gabonese student in Turkey, confirmed by her embassy and her university, provokes strong emotion among the African students welcomed in increasing numbers in the country.

The body of the young woman, 18-year-old Jeannah Danys Dinabongho Ibouanga, was found on Saturday in a river near a railway line, not far from the University of Karabük (north) where she was studying mechanical engineering, report Turkish media.

According to initial findings, the young woman died "drowned" and no other injuries or traces of sexual violence were identified.

The exact cause of death should be specified after an autopsy, the report of which is expected "in the coming days", indicates the private channel NTV.

The Gabonese embassy in Ankara confirmed the death of the young woman on Wednesday, without further details but promising that she "will communicate later".

The Gabonese Ministry of Foreign Affairs expressed, in a press release read on Gabonese television, its "dismay and deep concern (after) the assassination of our compatriot", specifying that its representation in Turkey had received instructions from demand an autopsy and the opening of a judicial inquiry into this tragedy.

The rector of Karabük University published a message of condolence on the establishment's website, in Turkish and French, assuring that the young woman was "much loved by her friends and professors".


On Twitter, the hashtag #JusticepourDina spread among African students at her university, several dozen of whom demonstrated on the premises of the establishment, brandishing portraits of the victim.

In a voicemail, billed on Twitter as a call from 'Dina' to her mother, the crying student pleaded with her mother to let her go to Sakarya University, less than two hours' drive east from Istanbul: "There is no racism there", said the young woman.

Turkey, whose President Recep Tayyip Erdogan deploys intense diplomatic and economic activity in Africa, welcomes more than 61,000 students from the continent (compared to 40,000 in 2019), most of them benefiting from scholarships, indicated Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Cavusoglu visited South Africa last month, according to his remarks reported by the official Anadolu agency.

The minister then underlined that Ankara saw in education "the main axis of cooperation with the continent".

Diya died at the age of 79.


Oyesinmilola Diya, in a statement signed on behalf of the family, said Diya died in the early hours of Sunday.





He was the Chief of the General Staff between 1994 and 1997. However, he was arrested for treason in 1997.

Diya and some soldiers in the military allegedly planned to overthrow the regime of Abacha, and Diya and his cohorts were jailed. He was tried in a military tribunal and was given the death penalty. However, this was overturned after the untimely death of Abacha in 1998 by his successor, Abdusalami Abubakar. During his time in the army, Diya also served as chief of defence staff and was the military governor of Ogun state from January 1984 to August 1985. The late Lt. General Diya, soldier and lawyer, was born Monday, 3 April, 1944 in Odogbolu, Ogun State, South-west Nigeria.







Met cop who guarded Kate Middleton convinced there are still 'evil men' in the force

he former Police Officer of the Year warned a 'wall of silence' is protecting corrupt cops like David Carrick and Wayne Couzens A decorated former police officer who spent 17 years working for the Metropolitan Police and once guarded Kate Middleton, the Princess of Wales, has warned there are still "evil men" like David Carrick and Wayne Couzens hiding in the force.

Ricky Haruna, who was a police constable for Britain's biggest force and was awarded several commendations, has lifted the lid on her own experiences there.

A decorated former Metropolitan Police officer who guarded members of the Royal Family - including Kate, Princess of Wales - is convinced there are still "evil men" like Wayne Couzens and David Carrick embedded in the force who are "hiding in plain sight".

Ricky Haruna, 46, a former police officer of the year, has claimed there is a "wall of silence" running through the ranks of Britain's biggest police force protecting the likes of Sarah Everard's killer Couzens and serial rapist Carrick. The former officer has lifted the lid on her own experiences during her 17-year career as a police constable at Scotland Yard.

"I was trusted to guard Kate Middleton when she was dating Prince William. It was such a serious role – yet I had colleagues whose behaviour was absolutely reprehensible. Why would you put these guys in such a position of power and trust?"

The bombshell revelations from Ms Haruna come after a damning report published last week condemned the Met as institutionally racist, misogynistic and homophobic.

The review's author, Baroness Louise Casey, called on the parliamentary and diplomatic protection command in which Couzens and Carrick both worked to be disbanded. Ms Haruna said: "Sadly, and I've seen it all with my own eyes. There's a wall of silence in the Met that protects these awful characters. You look at Carrick and the things he did.

That wasn't by chance."He was a repeat offender able to work unchecked and keep getting away with it. He was complained about and nothing happened – that just gave him even more confidence to carry out increasingly evil crimes while wearing the badge. "It's this culture that allows people like him and Couzens to do what they did. It starts with smaller behaviours that go unchecked and become more sinister."

Ms Haruna had to endure battles with racism after joining the Metropolitan Police as a PC in 2002, the Mirror has reported.



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People Are Still Making Money Off Late Rapper Tupac Shakur's Legacy 27 Years Later

upac Shakur is a legendary rapper who left us too soon according to fans. However, when it comes to those who have fallen in charge of his estate and likeness, Pac continues to bring in money every year despite being gone over 27 years now. How is it that Tupac continues to bring in so much cash, and who is benefiting off of it?

Tupac recorded a ton of music prior to his passing in 1996. He released four albums while still alive, including the classics Me Against The World and All Eyez On Me. Since his passing, six albums have been released, two more than he dropped living. These albums were released through Interscope records, making the label heads there tons of money. In addition to albums released in his name, there have also been books, a clothing line, movies, and more geared toward helping people get rich off his legacy.

The label also profited off a live performance film they released in 2005 and an "interactive biography" that featured poems, family photos, and more. The most famous use of Tupac Shakur's likeness to make money was at the 2012 Coachella Festival, where they premiered a hologram of the West Coast legend. The whole thing took place during a set by Snoop Dogg and featured a hologram that looked just like Tupac. Fans were stunned at its likeness.


It is not just the labels making millions on Tupac; fans and people close to him are too. One search of "Tupac memorabilia" yields thousands of results. Some sites are selling posters and figurines of the rap legend, including bobbleheads and action figures. There are other sites looking for people with autographs from the star and willing to pay thousands for them. One website reports that "an original Tupac Shakur autograph, on a letter from 1995, sold for almost \$10,000."

Three years ago, a video was published discussing the highest prices people have paid for Tupac memorabilia. Tupac's first record contract from 1991 with record label TNT was auctioned off for \$8,000 and featured his signature three times. A Dolce and Gabbana jacket he was frequently seen wearing in the '90s was sold for \$8k after his passing. A gold Death Row chain he wore in his lifetime was eventually sold for big bucks, too, thanks to it being featured on his album covers. The chain was estimated to be around \$7k but was auctioned for \$15k.

The latest person looking to cash in on some Tupac craze is an ex-girlfriend who allegedly has intimate images of the late rapper. While Pac posed partially clothed for David LaChapelle, this woman claims she has the full monty and is willing to sell these photos for the right price. It is rumored that Pac liked to flash people and that this particular picture was taken at a house party in 1990.

The woman selling the photo has an edited version of it up on an auction site with other pictures from the evening proving it is Pac's. She is asking for \$7,500. The auction is reportedly closed and it is unclear if she ever made money off the pictures.



Parole board refuses early release for convicted killer Oscar Pistorius

he former Olympic and Paralympic athlete, known as the Blade
Runner, had applied for parole after serving half of his jail term.
Disgraced South African sprinter Oscar Pistorius has been denied early release from prison, ten years after he was convicted of killing his girlfriend Reeva Steenkamp.

Pistorius, who is serving more than 13 years for her murder, applied for a parole hearing last year, arguing that he had served more than half his sentence.

But on Friday the board, which includes representatives from the prison service, police and civilians, ruled that he will have to stay in prison for at least another year and four months after it was decided that he had not served the "minimum detention period" required to be released.

The parole board hearing Pistorius' application ruled he would be able to apply again in August 2024, South Africa's Department of Corrections said in a statement. The board cited a new clarification on Pistorius' sentence that was issued by South Africa's Supreme Court of Appeal three days ago, according to the statement.

The result was a surprise but there has been legal wrangling over when Pistorius should be eligible for parole because of the series of appeals in his case. He was initially convicted of culpable homicide, a charge comparable to manslaughter, in 2014 but the case went through a number of appeals before Pistorius was finally sentenced to 13 years and five months in prison for murder in 2017.

Tania Koen, a lawyer for the Steenkamp family, told reporters: "I can confirm that parole has been denied, they will reconvene in a year to reconsider him again and we don't know the reasons yet [for the denial].

"I've just received a call from the parole board It is a huge sense of relief for June."

Steenkamp's parents still believe he is lying about their daughter's killing and opposed the former Olympic runner's application for parole, their lawyer said Friday.

"Unless he comes clean, they don't feel that he is rehabilitated," lawyer Tania Koen told reporters outside the Atteridgeville Correctional Centre prison in Pretoria, where Pistorius has been incarcerated since 2016 and where his parole hearing took place Friday.

"He's the killer of their daughter. For them, it's a life sentence," Koen said before the hearing.

Earlier, Reeva's mother June Steenkamp told Sky News that Pistorius was "not remorseful or rehabilitated" ahead of the hearing.









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



































































Anthony Joshua beats Jermaine Franklin by unanimous decision

nthony Joshua has beaten Jermaine Franklin on the judges' scorecards after a gruelling 12 round contest.

Going into the fight, Anthony Joshua needed to make a statement with many hoping for a vintage 'AJ' knockout which made him a huge star in boxing.

Under the watchful eyes of new trainer Derrick James, it was clear that the Texan wanted Joshua to utilise his devastating right hand by probing Franklin with the jab in the opening round.

Franklin tried to combat this by establishing his own jab, but whenever the American looked to go on the offensive, Joshua capitalised with some shots of his own targeting the body.

As the fight progressed through the middle rounds, Joshua's right hand became more prevalent and while they were landing, Franklin was still standing akin to his meeting with Dillian Whyte late last year.

Credit has to be given to Franklin, the majority of fans expected him to not make it past six rounds against the former unified world champion and it looked like an early night was on the cards in the sixth when a Joshua right uppercut narrowly missed his opponent.

In heavyweight boxing, stamina is vital and despite losing a significant amount of weight for this fight, Franklin was showing signs of tiredness from round eight onwards and this led to a rather messy conclusion.


Clinches aplenty, Franklin looked to keep the fight at close range. While this strategy seemed to be working, the 29-year-old rocked Franklin with another right uppercut in the tenth.




But that early finish never came, and the fight went to the judges' scorecards with two officials scoring the fight 117-111 and the other 118-111 in the Brit's favour.

As expected, WBC world heavyweight champion Tyson Fury's name was mentioned post-fight as a possible next opponent for Joshua and it is the one fans are crying out for. However, it's clear there is still plenty to develop when it comes to the relationship between Joshua and his new trainer Derrick James, and maybe pushing for a world title shot in the Summer is a step too far.

World Happiness Day: Nigerians and laughing in pain

igeria reminds one of a scene in the legendary 1994 Lion King animation when Simba and Nala went beyond the pride rock and were chased by the hyenas. They were obviously in danger because they had gone to the hyenas den. When Zazu the bird, their guard, told them how much danger they were in, Simba said, "I laugh in the face of danger," and went on to laugh.

Such is the typical case of Nigerians, we laugh in the face of our challenges.

Unarguably, Nigerians are happy people and regardless of the ugly situation the country seems to be in, we find happy moments in them.

It is no news that Nigeria is plagued by so many issues yet, even in the face of all these challenges, Nigeria ranks 95th happiest country in the world and sixth happiest country in Africa, with 4.981 points, according to the latest edition of the World Happiness Report, recently released.

One would wonder what is there for Nigerians to be happy about when they pray for basic amenities such as light, water, good roads and good healthcare among many other issues. These amenities are basic things that every government should provide for its citizens yet, they are only wishful thoughts for Nigerians.

Recently, the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) backed by the federal government redesign the N1000, N500 and N200 notes and retrieved the old ones from the public. This move by the CBN has almost thrown the country into chaos. This is an example of many policies the government often make that further increases the hardship on citizens. For more than a decade, North East Nigeria has been a war zone with many people displaced and living in Internally Displace Persons camps (IDPs).

Kidnapping and banditry has been rocking the country, the fuel scarcity and the price hike and most recently, the outcome of the general elections that has left the country a little unsettled. These and many other challenges are good reasons to make Nigerians sad and pathetic people yet, we are thriving and among the happiest nations in the world.

According to the reports, Mauritius tops African countries with 5.902 points, Algeria (5.329), South Africa (5.275), Congo Brazzaville (5.267), Guinea (5.072), Cote d'Ivoire (5.053) and Gabon (5.035).

Again, Finland remains world's happiest country. The nation, which houses 5.5 million people, has held the title for six years in a row. The United Kingdom dropped to 19th, two places behind the last ranking, while the United States jumped up one place to 15th and France dropped out of the top 20.

Scientists behind the report concluded that the COVID-19 pandemic has not made us unhappier. The report is now in its 11th year.

It assigns a happiness score on a scale of zero to 10, based on an average over a three-year period. This year, the authors also used data from social media to compare people's emotions before and after the COVID-19 crisis.

Eight of the 10 happiest nations were found in Europe, with Denmark scooping second place, at 7.58 points.

It was followed by Iceland, Israel and The Netherlands, which recorded scores of 7.53, 7.47 and 7.40, respectively. Canada, which was ranked 13th, went two places up. Lithuania is the only new country in the top 20, rising more than 30 places since 2017. War-scarred Afghanistan and Lebanon remain the two unhappiest countries in the survey, retaining bottom spots, with average life evaluations more than five points lower than in the 10 happiest countries.

Sierra Leone also fared poorly, falling to 135th position, ranking the third unhappiest country with 3.14 points.

March 20 is the International Day of Happiness, a day set aside by the United Nations and the World Happiness report is a publication of the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network. The network draws survey data from people in more than 150 countries.

The report rank countries happiness based on their average life evaluations over three preceding years and in this case, 2020 to 2022.

The report indicated that global happiness has not taken a hit in the three years of the Covid-19 pandemic and life evaluations from 2020 to 2022 have been "remarkably resilient," the report says.

John Helliwell, a co-author of the report told CNN in an interview that "benevolence to others, especially the helping of strangers, which went up dramatically in 2021, stayed high in 2022.

Even during these difficult years, positive emotions have remained twice as prevalent as negative ones, and feeling of positive social support twice as strong as those of loneliness," he said.

Happiness is free and indeed, everyone deserves to be happy regardless of the situation around. Since happiness is free and not in the hands of government, Nigerians have chosen to stay happy even in the face of daring economic hardship and other challenges.













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












































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














