# AN EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW WITH AWARD-WINNING REALTOR -Ngozi Iwuanyanwu

n this edition, our special Cover Girl is a Nigerian and an award-winning realtor, Ngozi Nwuanyanwu. Ngozi has seen her fair share of ups and downs in the real estate market. In this interview, we go over how she got started in the real estate industry and what agents need to know to be top-producing agents. I found Ngozi a lovely, warm, beautiful, conscientious, professional, and gracious interviewee.

A-CHOICES: You are one of the youngest Real Estate entrepreneurs in Nigeria, a role model worth emulating. Please tell us what inspired you to get into this Real Estate field.

NGOZI: My dad inspired me as I watched him make good and bad decisions in real estate while growing up. His love for real estate rubbed off on me.

A-CHOICES: For some reason, real



estate remains a haven investment asset class at a time in Nigeria when inflation is sweeping across economies like a whirlwind. When inflation rises, owners of real estate assets are protected would you say that real estate is a good hedge against inflation?

NGOZI: It certainly is, with inflation at 28.9%, investing in money market instruments or fixed deposits cannot give yields above inflation. The only asset class that can achieve that is real estate. There is always value appreciation in real estate which helps

to hedge against inflation.

A-CHOICES: Many members of the Diaspora Nigerian community are drawn to investing in Nigerian real estate. For them, it represents a means of establishing a connection with their ancestral land, contributing to local development, and potentially achieving financial security. However, managing real estate investments from abroad can present challenges. What do you have to say?

NGOZI: It has its peculiar challenges because they are far from home and cannot monitor the transactions if purchasing, and managing the asset when already purchased. The best way is to engage a facility management company charged with the responsibility of maintaining the

property and or collecting rent on behalf of their clients where necessary.

### A-CHOICES: How Nigerians In Diaspora Can Invest In Real Estate In Nigeria Without Getting Scammed?

NGOZI: Using reputable real estate firms. Some Nigerian real estate companies have branches abroad which makes transacting easier and more convenient

### A-CHOICES: Factors to Consider Before Investing in Nigerian Real Estate?

NGOZI: Your budget: how much is the property and how much can you afford? Do you have access to finance? Location: where is the property located? Is it accessible, is there water, or electricity? Security and crime rates also have to be considered. Value is also affected by location.

Use: what you require the house for will determine the type of property you invest in. If it is for rent, the location and size of the property need to be considered. If it's for dwelling, the number of people who would stay there needs to be taken into account. If it is commercial, it should be located close to the city centre.

### A-CHOICES: Being an Entrepreneur, How do you manage your work-life balance?

NGOZI: I try to create time to relax and take a break from work from time to time. It's necessary to balance the 2 to avoid burnout.

### A-CHOICES: In your work, what is an average day like?

NGOZI: I plan my day the night before, draw up a schedule or a to-do list, and pick out the Clothes to wear based on the activities for the day. If I'm going on a site inspection, I wake up early to prepare. I try to get to the site before my clients because I know how important being on time is. My day usually ends around 6 pm and I might go to the cinema or do something exciting to ease the pressure of the day.

A-CHOICES: During the pandemicsavaged year, when home sales plunged and commercial realty was facing a tough time, how did you manage to do business during this most trying phase?

NGOZI: Due to the pandemic, we all had to stay at home as directed by the government. Staying at home 24/7 got a

lot of people reassessing their living conditions making many people demand more comfortable and functional accommodation. So despite the pandemic, the demand for housing did not decline and a lot of sales were made during the period.

#### A-CHOICES: Which people or books



have been pivotal in your real estate journey?

NGOZI: Good to great by Jim Collins

A-CHOICES: What marketing materials are considered to be a first point of contact?

NGOZI: Complimentary card



A-CHOICES: Economic Freedom' means making your money work for you. It focuses on investing in assets rather than liabilities. Globally, Real estate is the greatest driver of asset accumulation. Real estate appreciates and is relatively immune to inflation. Can you expatiate on the concept of economic freedom through real estate?

NGOZI: As I had mentioned earlier, real estate is an asset that appreciates, only in rare occasions do you have a depreciation such as it was during the global financial crises of 2008, however, the impact was not greatly felt in Nigeria. A property bought at N100MM today could be worth 250MM in 5 years. No other asset class gives that level of return.

NGOZI: My drive to be better than I was yesterday

### Carl Weathers, 'Rocky's' Apollo Creed and 'Mandalorian' Actor, Dies at 76

merican actor Carl Weathers, who starred as Apollo Creed in the first four "Rocky" films opposite Sylvester Stallone, died Thursday, his manager Matt Luber confirmed. He was 76.

"We are deeply saddened to announce the passing of Carl Weathers," his family said in a statement. "He died peacefully in his sleep on Thursday, February 1st, 2024. ... Carl was an exceptional human being who lived an extraordinary life. Through his contributions to film, television, the arts and sports, he has left an indelible mark and is recognized worldwide and across generations. He was a beloved brother, father, grandfather, partner and friend."

Weathers also starred in 1987's "Predator" and had a memorable role in Adam Sandler's "Happy Gilmore." He was nominated for a Primetime Emmy Award for Outstanding Guest Actor in a Drama Series for his work in the "Star Wars" series "The Mandalorian.

Born on January 14, 1948, in New Orleans, Weathers appeared in more than 75 films and TV shows during his 50-year screen career.

Weathers showed off his comedy chops in a memorable arc on Arrested Development, playing a version of



himself as an ad-hoc acting coach who proudly offered tips on saving money at everything from food buffets to airport rides. He appeared in four episodes across the Emmy-winning series' first four seasons.


He also appeared as Police Chief





Hampton Forbes in more than two dozen episodes of the 1989-95 TV series In the Heat of the Night starring Carroll O'Connor and Howard Rollins. Weathers was a series regular in the 1993-94 seventh and final season and appeared in the post-series telefilms.

But Weathers is best known for playing Apollo Creed, the heavyweight champion of the world who gave journeyman Philly boxer Rocky Balboa (Sylvester Stallone) a shot at the title in 1976's Rocky. Weathers reprised the role in Rocky II (1979), which featured a title rematch with Balboa, and 1982's Rocky III, where he trained Balboa to



fight the brutish Clubber Lang (Mr. T). Creed's final film in the franchise was Rocky IV (1985), where he was killed in the ring by chiseled Russian heavyweight Ivan Drago (Dolph Lundgren).



# Death Row inmate who survived 18 lethal injections ended up dying of something completely different

A Death Row inmate who survived his execution after 18 failed attempts to administer a lethal injection instead died behind bars of something else.


He was not the first Death Row prisoner to avoid his execution date due to a failure to deliver a lethal injection, with the recently executed Kenneth Smith surviving his first execution due to a failure with a lethal injection.

American man Romell Broom was sentenced to death for the abduction, rape and murder of 14-year-old Tryna Middleton, who he had killed in September 1984.

Broom had been paroled from prison in May of that year after raping a 12-year-old girl and committing armed robbery in 1975. He was arrested in December 1984 after assaulting and abducting an 11-year-old girl where the child's mother had held onto his car and

screamed for help. That had given two witnesses time to spot his license plate and he was arrested the same day.

Broom tried to offer a deal of pleading guilty in exchange for a 30 year sentence but this offer was refused and he was sentenced to death. He spent around 25 years on Death Row before his sentence



was due to be carried out on 15 September, 2009.

However, Broom survived his execution after those meant to administer the lethal injection spent two hours and 18 attempts trying to find a vein to establish a viable IV line. Prison



staff inserted the IV 18 times but were unable to find a suitable vein, and on one attempt they instead struck bone. According to the Death Penalty Information Center, a doctor who examined Broom after the failed execution attempt described the 18 unsuccessful attempts to set an IV line as 'somewhere between malpractice and assault'. Broom then tried to challenge the state of Ohio's authority to execute him, but the state's Supreme Court judged in 2016 that he could be executed.

Justice Judith Lanzinger gave the court's opinion that the 18 attempts to administer a lethal injection did not constitute a botched execution as setting the IV line is a preliminary step and not the actual act of execution itself. The Death Row inmate had tried to claim that another execution attempt would violate laws against placing a person in jeopardy of life twice.

However, the court decided that since his executioners had failed to set an IV line after 18 attempts and not actually



administered the drug his life had not actually been in jeopardy.

The court also denied Broom's claim that a second execution attempt would count as a cruel and unusual punishment, as their assumption was that prison personnel would carry out the execution successfully. Broom's next execution date was set for 17 June, 2020 but in April of that year he was granted a reprieve due to the lack of execution drugs available.

The convicted murderer's execution date was put back to 16 March, 2022 but before he reached that date he died in prison due to suspected complications from Covid-19.

# Pastor sentenced to life imprisonment for rape

he Ikeja Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence court sentenced founder of iReign Christian Ministry, Feyi Daniels, to life imprisonment for "raping a church member" on Friday, 26 January.



The Judge, Justice Rahman Oshodi, found the Lagos-based pastor guilty of rape and sexual assault of a female worshipper and held that the pastor be remanded for the rest of his life at the Kirikiri prison in Lagos.

Oshodi said that the prosecution established beyond doubt the ingredients of the two offences against him by a 19-year-old church member and a 23-year-old assistant pastor. According to him, Daniels is a liar and does not have any regard for truth.

In his own defence, the pastor who pleaded not guilty, testified that he believed three out of the four women who accused him of sexually assaulting them conspired to turn against him.

The prosecution lead counsel, Babajide Boye, established that the defendant had a 'personal relationship' with the four women.

Boye alleged that the defendant had counseled one of the women, given the amount of N100,000 to another for hospital treatment, paid school fees for a third, and related with a fourth as a leader in the campus fellowship affiliated with his ministry at Akungba-Akobo in Ondo State.

However, Daniels denied giving money to any of the women for treatment. He said, "I believe all three ladies turned against me, but not (name withheld)



because she later apologised to me." When queried why the accusations from the ladies were all sexual in nature, the defendant said he didn't know.

Boye also accused the defendant of using his position as a Pastor to manipulate persons, particularly young women who came to him for counseling.

"You are a man of God. Are you not? A powerful man of God. You were trained to counsel, and you use wisdom and the leading of the spirit to manipulate," Boye asked.

Again, the pastor denied the allegation, saying, "I am not a powerful man; I am a pastor. I do not use power to counsel people; I am not a manipulator."

The Prosecutor continued, "You visited your Akungba fellowship centre, and



when she (one of the alleged victims) saw you, she hissed. Were you not surprised as a pastor?

"No. She was disgruntled because I couldn't help her financially," he responded. He also denied tampering with WhatsApp messages between him and one of the alleged victims.

The prosecutor during trial tried to tender four statements reportedly written by the defendant while he was in police custody at various intervals





last year.

"There are contradictions between the defendant's testimony and the contents of the documents. We seek to use them to impeach his testimony. We rely on section 232 of the Evidence Act, that evidence even though obtained improperly is still admissible and we urge the court to admit the same," Boye said.

The defence counsel, Adebayo Adegbite, raised objections to the admissibility of the statements. He argued that the statements were not made by the defendant and that the pastor was made to signed them under duress.

"The statements are a mixture of confession and denial. We leave it to the court to determine whether they amount to a confession. Right from the

start of this trial, the defendant has denied the charges, that's his plea. The documents weren't made voluntarily. Even if there were contradictions, he wasn't the maker of the documents, they were written by the police," Adegbite stated.

In his ruling, Justice Oshodi admitted the documents. The judge said, "By section 9(3) and (4) of the Administration of Criminal Justice Law of Lagos State (2021), the presence of a video testimony of the suspect is desirable but not compulsory. I will admit the documents and later consider the evidential value to place on them. The objection of the defence is hereby overruled."

The Lagos State Directorate of Public Prosecutions, Ministry of Justice in March of 2023, ordered the arraignment

of the Lekki-based pastor, over the alleged rape of an assistant pastor of his church and another lady.

Oluwafeyiropo Daniel is the founder of I Reign Christian Ministry, Ikota, Lekki, he was popular on social media last year for making prophecies about the outcome of the 2023 general elections. His sentencing is an indication that victims of sexual violence can justice and has further encouraged victims who are hiding to step forward and report the perpetrators. It has also restored some level of trust in the judicial system of the country.

Many women suffer in silence for fear that the perpetrators would be allowed to walk free when reported or would be questioned and blamed for being a victim. His church members still believe the judgement would be overturned.

### Namibian President Hage Geingob dies in a hospital where he was receiving treatment

amibia's President Hage Geingob, a veteran of the country's liberation struggle and its first post-independence prime minister, died on Sunday.

Tributes to the 82-year-old statesman poured in from African leaders who saw him as a hero of the anti-apartheid struggle.

And Germany's Chancellor Olaf Scholz expressed regret that his country had lost "a partner who was committed to the process of coming to terms with Germany's colonial history". Recently,

Geingob supported South Africa's complaint against Israel under the Genocide Convention and condemned Namibia's former colonial ruler Germany for opposing the case.

In a post on the social media platform X, formerly Twitter, the Namibian presidency said Geingob's medical team at Lady Pohamba Hospital did its best to help him, but Geingob died with his wife, Monica Geingos, and children by his side.

Geingob was undergoing treatment for cancer. The 82-year-old had a



colonoscopy and a gastroscopy on Jan. 8, followed by a biopsy, his office said last month.

Angolo Mbumba, Namibia's acting president, called for calm, saying in the same post that the "Cabinet will convene with immediate effect in order to make the necessary state arrangements in this regard."

Geingob, who was president of the southern African nation since 2015, was set to finish his second and final term in office this year. In 2014, he said he had survived prostate cancer.

Namibia is set to hold elections to choose a new leader in November.

Born in a village in northern Namibia in 1941, Geingob was its first president outside the Ovambo ethnic group, which makes up more than half of the country's population.

He took up activism against South Africa's apartheid regime, which at the time ruled over Namibia, from his early schooling years before being driven into exile.

He spent almost three decades in Botswana and the US, leaving the former for the latter in 1964.

While in the US, he remained a vocal advocate for Namibia's independence, representing the local liberation movement, Swapo, now the ruling party, at the UN and across the Americas.



He suffered a couple of health scares in his later years, having undergone brain surgery in 2013 and heart valve surgery in South Africa in June 2023.

An avid football fan, he played as a young man, which earned him the nickname Danger Point.

He was married three times, in 1967, 1993 and again in 2015 and had as many children.

### Davido debuted on Billboard Hot 100 ahead of the Grammy Awards

frobeats artists Davido and Lojay made their first appearances on the Billboard Hot 100, with featured credits on Chris Brown's "Sensational."

Released Oct. 20 via CBE/RCA Records, the song debuts at No. 96 on the Hot 100 (dated Feb. 3) with 15.7 million radio airplay audience and impressions up (14%) and 2.6 million official U.S. streams (up 3%) in the Jan. 19-25 tracking week, according to Luminate.

The song is the second single from Brown's 11th studio album 11:11, released in November. The set debuted and peaked at No. 1 on Top R&B Albums and No. 9 on the Billboard 200. "Sensational" has been building at multiple radio formats: It rises 11-9 on R&B/Hip-Hop Airplay, 16-10 on Mainstream R&B/Hip-Hop Airplay and 16-14 on Rhythmic Airplay and debuts at No. 30 on Adult R&B Airplay. On the all-format Radio Songs chart, it pushes 49-44.

Davido has become one of the most popular Afrobeats musicians, has



released four studio LPs in his career: Omo Baba Olowo in 2012, A Good Time (2019), A Better Time (2020) and Timeless (March 2023). His two most recent albums reached Nos. 170 and 37 on the Billboard 200, respectively, marking his first appearances on the chart.

Davido has also posted 25 songs on the Billboard U.S. Afrobeats Songs chart. On Billboard's World Digital Song Sales chart, Davido has charted 27 songs – 18 of which reached the top 10 – all since 2016. That's the second most among Afrobeats artists, after Wizkid (29).


"Sensational" isn't the first







collaboration between Davido and Brown. The pair additionally teamed up for "Blow My Mind" and "Lower Body," both in 2019, "Shopping Spree," also with Young Thug, in 2021 and "Nobody Has to Know" in 2022. Davido has also recorded with Nicki Minaj, Pop Smoke, Popcaan, Quavo, Rae



Sremmurd and Summer Walker, among others.

He's slated to perform this April at Madison Square Garden on his extended Timeless Tour. He's also nominated for three Grammy Awards at the upcoming ceremony this weekend: best global music performance (for "Feel"), best African music performance (for "Unavailable") and best global music album (for Timeless).

As for Lojay, the fellow Nigerian artist tallied his first Billboard chart appearance in 2022 with another Chris Brown collab: "Monalisa," also with Sarz. The track reached No. 8 on and No. 38 on Rhythmic Airplay.

Lojay has released three Eps: Midnight Vibes in 2017, LV N ATTN with Sarz in 2021, and Gangster Romantic in March 2023.

Afrobeats has gained dominance in the music industry with artists achieving success across the world. It has been referred to as one of Africa's 'biggest cultural' or 'musical' exports. It is also an indication that the Nigerian music industry has evolved placing it on the world map.

Its global popularity has been marked by Grammy wins, viral dance challenge and sold-out arena tours.

finals.









# Victor Erouhwo: Former TFL worker forced to sleep on streets after 'cruel' Home Office visa delays

I'm shackled" - Victor Erouhwo describes the vicious cycle of losing his visa, then his job, and then his home. A former TFL worker facing deportation has been forced to sleep on the streets of London this winter as the Home Office has been accused of ignoring his visa application, The Independent can reveal.

Victor Erouhwo, 41, has been fighting to remain in Britain after his visa expired and he was unable to afford the costs of applying for an extension.

Having moved to Britain from Nigeria in 2007 to pursue studies, Mr Erouhwo eventually gained a Limited Leave to Remain Visa on a 10-year route to indefinite leave to remain.

However, he was unable to afford the fee of more than £4,000 for his visa extension and became classed as an "overstayer" by the government in January 2022.

Mr Erouhwo's immigration status caused him to lose his job as a maintenance worker for TFL the same month, where he earned less than the national average salary. With no income, the father-of-two was unable to afford his rent and consequently became homeless.

"I'm shackled and can't do anything for myself," Victor told The Independent. "I've never been homeless before, I've never been in this situation. I am helpless and destitute.

"There are misconceptions about being homeless; people think we put ourselves in this situation. But that's not the case when it comes to me.

"If the government would allow me to work then I would be grateful. All I want is an opportunity to help myself but I can't."

For years, campaigning groups have been lobbying against "eye-

wateringly" expensive visa application prices, with charities like Praxis accusing ministers of "treating migrants like cash cows".

"There are misconceptions about being homeless; people think we put ourselves in this situation. But that's not the case when it comes to me," Mr Erouhwo says.

Mr Erouhwo, who says he's been relying on the generosity of strangers to buy biscuits and spending time in libraries for warmth, continued: "I've been living and working in the UK, paying my taxes for years.

"Sometimes I think I'd prefer if I died; things would be easier because then there would be no trouble because there'd be no more me. It's really hard when there's no way out of this situation right now."

Charities have expressed an interest in helping Mr Erouhwo, however they're unable to assist due to his Home Office application being unresolved as the government is clamping down on migration.

Though visa fee waivers are available for people who apply to the Home Office for assistance, Mr Erouhwo has yet to receive a response following a waiver application he initially lodged in April.

Naga Kandiah, public law solicitor from



MTC Solicitors which is now representing Mr Erouhwo on a probono basis, said: "There are long delays by the Home Office for visa extension applications, during this time, applicants are left in limbo and unable to earn money, in turn, losing their homes and forcing employers to terminate their jobs due to their immigration status.

"Now due to the incredibly cruel new policies which are being implemented by the government, Mr Erouhwo faces destitution and his life is at stake, he is unable to access housing or even sleep in the streets. "Homeless charities have been unable to help our client due to his immigration status and the government has provided no support for Mr Erouhwo in this instance," lawyer Naga Kandiah says.

Councillor Promise Knight, Brent council's Cabinet Member for Housing, Homelessness & Renters' Security, said: "We have complete sympathy for his situation as no one deserves to be sleeping rough on the streets.

"Brent is prevented from helping people like Mr Erouhwo to find a more permanent home because of the rules the Home Office puts in place around immigration.

"However, despite this, we have done everything in our power to help Mr Erouhwo. Our housing outreach team is working with Mr Erouhwo's solicitor to help with his visa application and we hope his situation with the Home Office is worked out soon."

A Home Office spokesperson said: "Fee waivers are carefully considered on their individual merits. It is longstanding government policy that we do not routinely comment on individual cases."

And, following the game, Camara - who had played 87 minutes before being replaced by Idrissa Gana Gueye - was one of several Senegal players who were distraught with the result.

Understandably, this was his first AFCON and he emerged best young player in the group stage. He has also won some laurels at the U-20 Continental stage and doing well in the French Ligue 1.

## Tobi Amusan sets new 60m hurdle record

Amusan, broke the African women's indoor record in the 60-meter hurdles at the New Balance Indoor Grand Prix in Boston on Sunday.

Amusan came second in the race, behind American Tia Jones who ran 7.72 seconds to set a new meeting record and a world-leading time for the year. Devynne Chalton of the Bahamas was third with 7.76 seconds in a close finish. This was Amusan's second record-breaking performance of the year after she eclipsed Gloria Alozie's 25-year-old African record in the same event on January 27. That was also her first race of the new athletics season.

Another Nigerian athlete, Favour Ofili, also impressed in the women's 300 meters, where she finished second with 35.99 seconds.

Ofili was behind Gabby Thomas from the US, who ran a world-leading time of



## Rapper Killer Mike Arrested at 2024 Grammys After Winning 3 Awards

apper Killer Mike was seen being walked out of the Grammy Awards in handcuffs Sunday night. Though it was not immediately clear why he was being arrested just before the Grammys broadcast began, the Los Angeles Police Department later released details about the misdemeanor charges.

In a video uploaded to X by The Hollywood Reporter's Chris Gardner, the "Run The Jewels" rapper was seen being

escorted through Crypto.com Arena by police.

The LAPD said on social media that the rapper was taken into custody because of a "physical altercation that occurred at the 700 block of Chick Hearn Court." They did not provide details on when that incident happened or what the circumstances were.

"The suspect was placed under arrest and was transported to LAPD Central





Division," according to a police statement.

"The suspect has been identified as 48-year-old Michael Render and booked for Misdemeanor Battery," the statement said, adding, "Render has been released on zero bail."

Just a short time before being detained, Killer Mike, aka Michael Render, swept all three categories he was nominated in: Best Rap Song, Best Rap Performance and Best Rap Album for his self-titled 2023 studio album "Michael."

"I'm a Black man in America, and as a kid I had a dream to become a part of music. And that 9-year-old is excitedly dancing inside of me right now," he said in one of his acceptance speeches Sunday.

Beating rap heavyweights like Drake, Kendrick Lamar, and Nicki Minaj, Killer Mike's wins Sunday — which were awarded before the prime-time Grammys broadcast began — marked his first Grammy trophies in over 20 years. He previously won Best Rap Performance by a Duo or Group at the 45th Grammy Awards for Outkast's "The Whole World."

"You cannot tell me that you get too old, you can't tell me it's too late, you can't tell me dreams come true! It is a sweep, it is a sweep, it is a sweep, it is a sweep!" he exclaimed after he danced around the stage with his third

Grammy of the night.



However, his spellbinding performance at the award ceremony left the audience in awe.

Nigerian singer Billy O told the BBC he was disappointed Nigerian singers did not win the award, saying this showed a lack of real appreciation for Afrobeats and Afro RnB by the voters.

"Despite dominating in Africa, I think we are not really well appreciated when it comes to Grammys," he said.

Despite the fierce rivalry between Nigeria and South Africa, three-time Grammy nominee Davido extended his congratulations to Tyla on X and told her to "keep soaring".

South Africa was also represented by comedian Trevor Noah who was at the helm of the prestigious award ceremony, which he hosted for a fourth time.


Jimi Solanke was one of the key shapers of Nigerian theatre and television in the second half of the last century.

The legendary poet and playwright died on Monday at the age of 81. He was said to have died while being rushed from his country home at Ipara Remo in Remo North Local Government Area of Ogun State to Babcock University Teaching Hospital, Ilisan when he succumbed to the cold hand of death. Chief Solanke was said to have been in and out of hospital from December until he died on Monday morning.

"It is with a heavy heart that President

Bola Tinubu receives the news of the passing of Nigeria's creative icon, Mr. Jimi Solanke, who died on Monday," presidential spokesperson Ajuri Ngelale wrote in a statement."Baba Solanke was an actor, dramatist, folk singer, poet, and playwright. Hon Dickson Awolaja representing Remo North State Constituency at the state Assembly confirmed his death on Monday afternoon.

Hon Awolaja said: "I got wind of the demise of Pa Jimi Solanke not long ago." His death is no doubt another big loss to us in Remo North and Ogun State as a whole given his worthy





contributions to the development of our dear nation." May his soul rest in peace."

Born on July 4, 1942, in Ipara Remo, Jimi Solanke's artistic journey began as a pioneer member of the Orisun Theatre Group, founded by the renowned Wole Soyinka, in 1961.

His contributions to the global entertainment industry spanned seven decades, leaving an indelible mark on various platforms, from the Western Nigeria Television in the 1960s to international festivals in Senegal and Algeria during the 1970s.

Solanke's versatility shone through in epic performances such as "Death and the King's Horseman," "Kurunmi," "Kongi's Harvest," "The Divorce," and "Ovaramwen Nogbaisi."

His captivating stagecraft and theatrical brilliance earned him accolades and recognition, both locally and internationally. The Oxford Times hailed him as a "Skilled Nigerian Actor," and the New York Times recognized him as the star of an "Excellent Troupe" during a performance of Wole Soyinka's "Kongi's Harvest."
